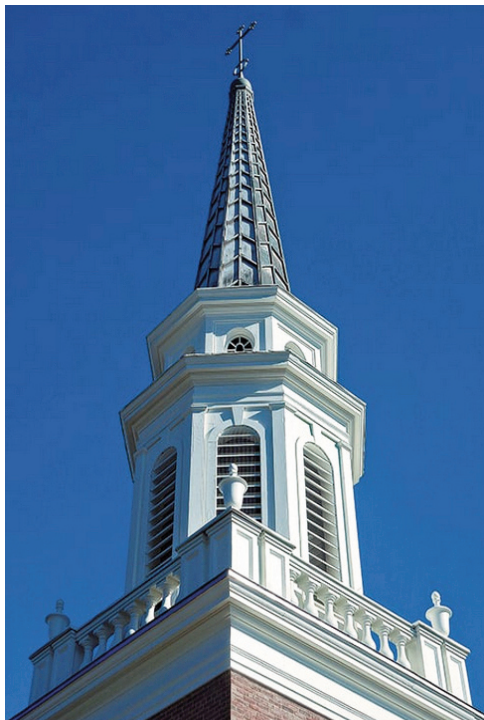

REFLECTION

Challenge of Corpus Christi: From an Idea Feast to a Living Feast!

We find a special group of feasts being celebrated since the Middle Ages: the 'feasts of ideas.' These do not focus on particular events of salvation but have as their object truths of faith, special aspects of Christian teaching and piety, or various titles of the Lord. Idea-feasts are also called 'devotion feasts' or dogmatic and thematic (in contrast to the feasts which have the redemptive actions of Christ for their object). The challenge of this feast is to make the transition from celebrating an idea to a way of life.

A liturgy is successful not because of its fidelity to some past ideal, but because it built up the Body of Christ into a spiritual temple and priesthood by forwarding the aim of Christian life: the love and service of God and neighbor; death to self in order to live for others as did Christ. The intention of the feast is named in the collect of the Mass:

Let us pray for the willingness to make present in our world the love of Christ shown to us in the Eucharist!

Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus

SECOND FRIDAY AFTER PENTECOST

June 7, 2024 | Mass 9:00 AM



To appreciate this solemnity properly we must not focus on the “heart” in itself, but on the heart as a symbol or image of Jesus’ love and self-sacrifice. Therefore this festival is really another festival of redemption. The preface captures this well: “Lifted high on the cross, Christ gave his life for us, so much did he love us. ... To his open heart the Savior invites all ... to draw water in joy from the springs of salvation.” We are invited into Jesus’ heart; therefore, we are invited to do as Jesus did—pour out our own hearts in love and self-giving for others. Yes, this is a festival of redemption!

In one sense this solemnity parallels and repeats what we celebrate on Good Friday, when Jesus’ side was opened with a lance and his heart was pierced. The Triduum context shaped our interpretation of Good Friday and had us focus on other aspects of the paschal mystery. Now, during Ordinary Time, we are privileged to have this solemnity to honor Jesus’ unbounded love for us when we can celebrate with more joy and exuberance. On this festival we are encouraged to unleash our own love, model it after that of Jesus, and spend ourselves for the sake of others. If we are faithful disciples no doubt our own hearts will also be pierced. But then, like Jesus, we must let flow from our own hearts the same love and mercy as flowed from Jesus’ Sacred Heart. 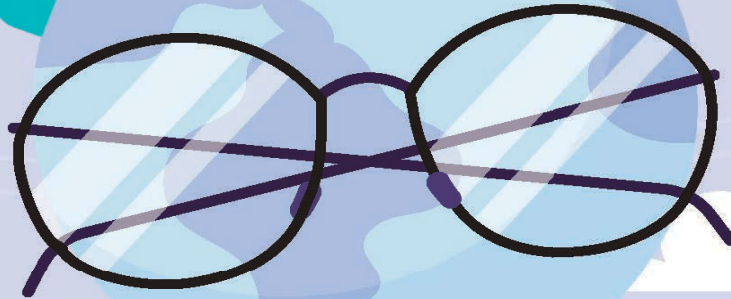

Our Sunday Obligation

“Much obliged” is an old fashioned phrase first noted in the Old Oxford English Dictionary in the sixteenth century. Over the centuries, the phrase has lost some of its richness. Originally, it meant to be bound to a person by ties of gratitude. Today, the phrase is more often used as an automatic response to someone who has performed a perfunctory service. Unfortunately, this practice does not convey the sense of truly being bound to each other by gratitude. What a loss! Because of that loss, many people understand the word obligation as a burden rather than a commitment and duty that flows from a relationship. Obligation is a form of indebtedness that comes from within the heart of a relationship. Think of the obligations that make for a rich family life. A parent does not say, “I wonder if I have to feed my children this week?” Husbands and wives carry out a myriad of obligatory tasks in service to each other during the course of a week and never ask, “Do I have to?” In loving relationships, we are grateful for the

gift of each other and we express that gratitude by doing right actions because we want to do so. Obligatory behaviors grow out of communication, intimacy, and personal and communal relationships. These examples can help us reflect on our “obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and on holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor” (Catechism of the Catholic Church, #2041).

The heart of Sunday obligation is gratitude. The word Eucharist means “to give thanks.” We gather each week because we are “much obliged” to God — for everything. This obligation is not an automatic response to someone who has performed a perfunctory service. We come together to “give thanks” to God, our Father who is the source of all life and creation, and to Jesus, God’s Son who gave us eternal life through his death on the Cross that is made present in every Mass as we participate again in Christ’s death and Resurrection through the Eucharist.

Each time we “attend Mass,” we bring our lives, our very selves, to the Eucharist. We gather together as a community, grateful to have each other as fellow pilgrims in faith and grateful to be nourished by the body and blood of Christ. Just as the relationships and obligations in families are nurtured and strengthened by intimacy and communion, so too does our participation in the Eucharist nurture and strengthen our relationship with the Trinity. Food nourishes our body in the same way that our participation in Holy Communion nourishes our spirit and unites us together as individuals and as a community in Christ. Acting on our Sunday obligation of being “much obliged” gives us reason to be “more obliged” in the most authentic sense of obligation. - Maureen A. Kelly

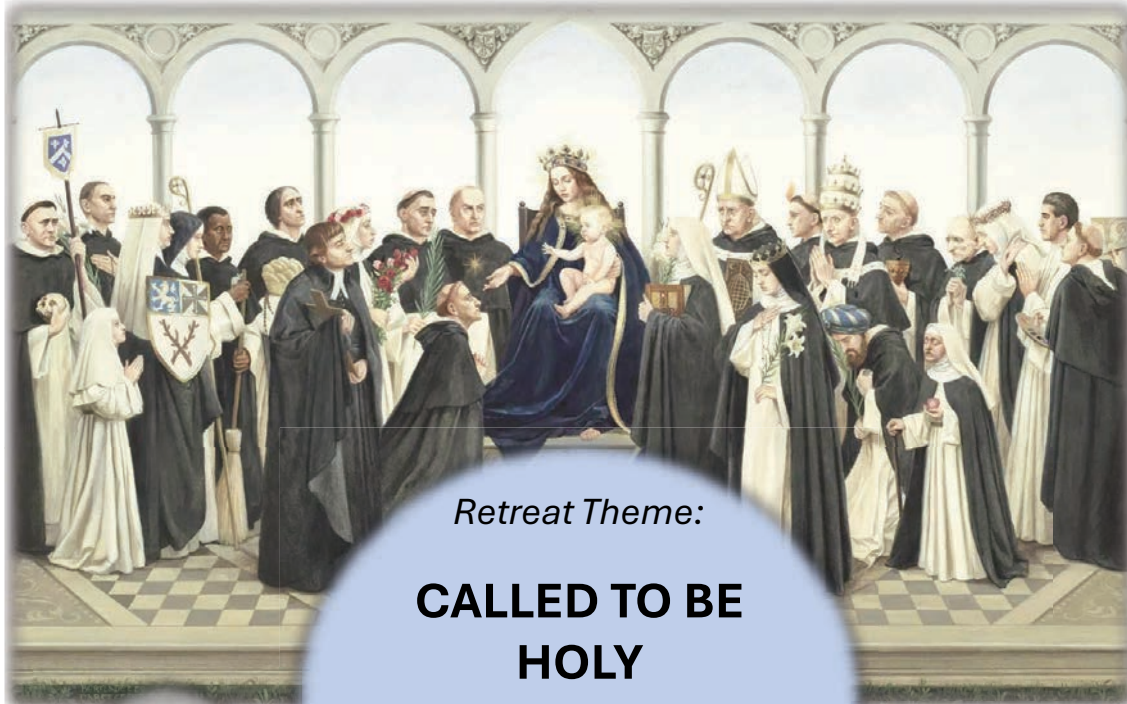

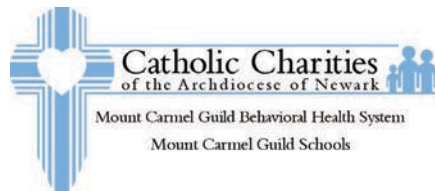


St. Rose Food Collection Sunday

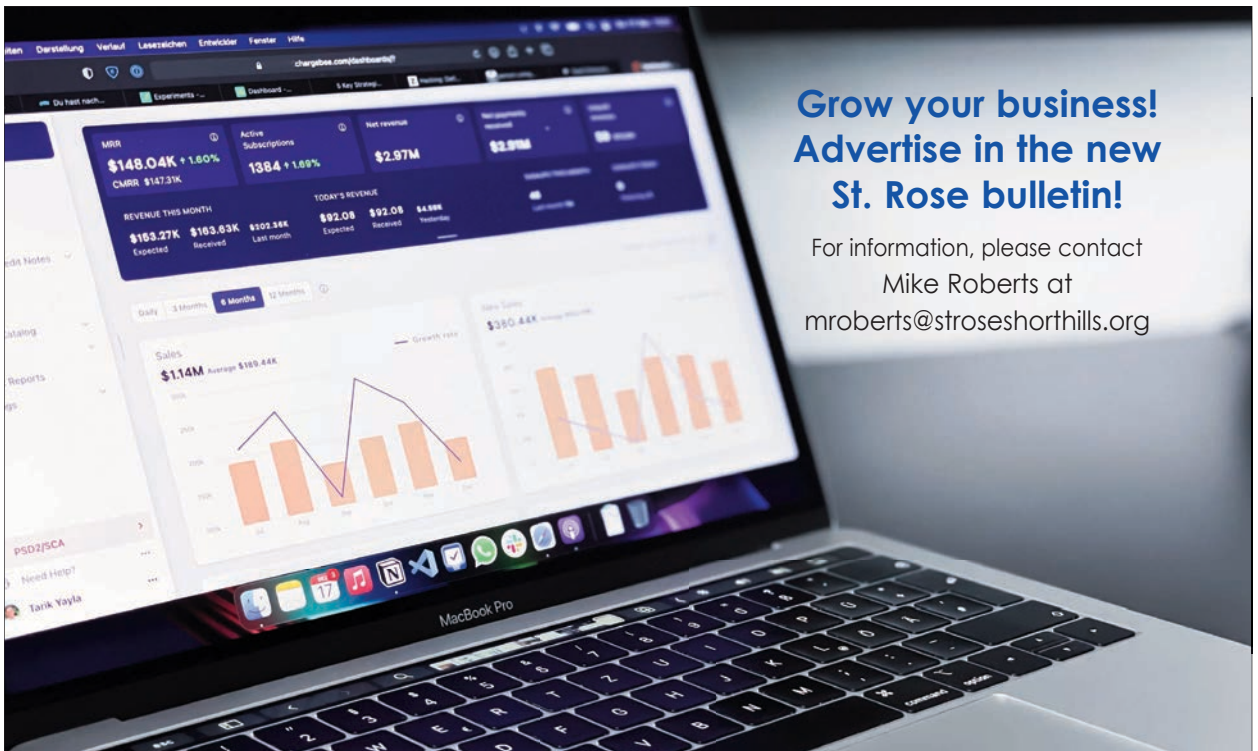
